## Regional Art Galleries Solo Show Application

Thank you for your interest in having a solo show in the Regional Art Galleries of the Arkell Museum and Canajoharie Library. While we welcome inquiries from individual artists, most often show dates are awarded to artists who have been accepted into The Art of New York: Annual Juried Art Show: <http://www.arkellmuseum.org/regional-art-call-for-entries>.

The Arkell Museum and Canajoharie Library offer three gallery spaces for solo artist shows; The Community Gallery, Southeast Gallery, and Stone Wall Gallery. Solo shows are ordinarily scheduled for one space. Artists are responsible for hanging and taking down their show. All work must be clearly labeled by the artist and ready to hang or display. Artists will be required to sign a release form when work is delivered. A 30% commission is retained on sales with the Museum and Library handling gallery purchases, tax and delivery of sold work to the buyer. Artwork must remain up for the duration of the show. **The Arkell Museum and Canajoharie Library does not insure the work of solo artists; this remains the responsibility of the artist.** Artists must comply with the show schedule for delivery and return of work. The Museum and Library will not store works for artists after exhibition.
